DISEASES OF THE CIRCULATION.

- 1. What are the circumstances which influence the prognosis in cases where Irregularity of the Heart is the predominant symptom?
- 2. Differentiate ordinary Palpitation from Tachycardia, and from the rapid pulsation of the Maladie de Graves in these cases in which there is neither goitre nor exopthalmos present.
- 3. Describe fully the structural changes which may occur in the Heart as a part of Senile Degeneration. And, more briefly, indicate the functional derangements which these may produce, and the means of diagnosis of their presence.
- 4. Enumerate the forms of Sub-acute and Chronic Pericarditis. Describe the physical signs, and the symptoms, local and general, of each; and discuss their differential diagnosis and treatment.
