MEDICAL JURISPRUDENCE.

1. State the order in which Putrefaction usually occurs in the various parts of the body, and the circumstances which hasten or retard its development.

3. Describe the symptoms and *post mortem* appearances in a case of death from a poisonous dose of Tartar Emetic.
4. Describe the respective advantages of distillation, boiling, and filtration in the purification of water. Mention the essentials of a good filter.
