PATHOLOGY

- 1. Give an account of syphilitic acritis, including a description of:—(a) Naked eye and microscopic changes in the wall of the acrta, (b) methods of examination of the tissue for the presence of spironemata and the results to be obtained, and (c) the secondary effects and complications of the disease.
- 2. Give a detailed account of the changes in the lymphatic glands in Hodgkin's disease and discuss the pathological diagnosis of the condition.
- 3. Give a description of the life history of taenia echinococcus, of the mode of infection of man and of the pathological conditions so produced.
- 4. Discuss chorionepithelioma from the points of view of incidence, site, structure, origin and malignancy.
