## VENEREAL DISEASES

- 1. Acute gonococcal salpingitis.—Describe the histology of the fallopian tube and the pathway of its infection by the gonococcus. Discuss the main points in the differential diagnosis and state the immediate treatment.
- 2. A patient, who is at the seventh month of pregnancy and suffers from syphilis, develops albuminuria during a course of "salvarsan" treatment. Discuss the aetiology of the albuminuria and the subsequent treatment of the syphilis.
- 3. Describe the morbid anatomy of the late syphilitic lesions of the tongue. Discuss the differential diagnosis of an ulcerating gumma of the tongue in a patient aged 50 years and state the treatment.
- 4. Acute epididymitis.—Discuss the aetiology and the differential diagnosis. In a case arising as a complication of acute gonorrhoea, state the indications for the operation of epididymotomy and describe the operation.
