## VENEREAL DISEASES

- 1. Condylomata acuminata. Discuss the aetiology and pathology of this condition. How would you treat a marked case in a female?
- 2. Syphilitic alopecia. Describe the forms of alopecia produced by syphilis and discuss the differential diagnosis from other forms of baldness.
- 3. Describe the signs and symptoms and discuss the diagnosis of chronic genococcal infection of the seminal vesicles. Discuss the treatment of this condition.
- 4. Tabes dorsalis. Describe the pathological changes found in the spinal cord in this disease. Discuss the treatment of cases of tabes dorsalis with (a) optic atrophy, (b) incontinence of urine, and (c) Charcot's disease of one knee-joint.
